Photo Transfer Collage and Beyond

Laurie Klein has built an international reputation as a photographer and creativity educator. A student of the great landscape photographer Ansel Adams, she evolved a unique style that combines her love of photographing nature with her skills at capturing the essence of relationships. She is particularly known for her infrared photography. Her work can be found in many private and museum collections.

This fun, hands-on class is for people of all ages who would like to unleash the artist within. The workshop will begin with the transferring of a photograph from a magazine or one that you have taken. Then textures will be added – found objects from nature and from home – and information subtracted – tearing, ripping and erasing what is already there. Next, new layers will be added by applying paints, crayons, pencils and markers. Soon you will have a totally different piece of artwork! This is the art of photo transfer collage.

Supplies:

Mod Podge: acrylic matte medium

Glue stick

11x14 flat canvas boards: 3 pieces

Brayers:

- a. Roller size is your preference
- b. A burnishing tool is also an option

Perfect Paper Adhesive (PPA):

- a. Matte or Glossy is your preference

E-6000:

- a. Or other clear glue or acrylic medium

Coloring mediums of your choice:

- a. Acrylics
- b. Oils
- c. Pastels
- d. colored pencils

- e. water colors
- f. crayons
- g. markers

Photographs:

- a. (black and white or color)
- b. Or other clippings such as magazine or postcard images

Raw Materials:

- a. Rice paper
- b. Japanese paper
- c. Cloth
- d. other materials

Found objects for texture such as:

- a. buttons
- b. shells
- c. sand
- d. stamps

Additional Suggested Supplies (not required):

Some other ideas: Stamp pads, gold stars, decals, beads etc

Scissors

Sponge on a stick (different sizes)

Brushes (different sizes)

Tooth picks.

Magazines to share- such as National Geographic Magazines
